- 2) **stand** in the path of sinners, nor
- 3) **sit** in the seat of scoffers!

- 1) his delight is in the law of the LORD, and
- 2) in His law he meditates day and night. And

he will be **like a tree**

see Jeremiah 17:5-8

*firmly planted by streams of water, which*

- a) yields its fruit in its season, and
- b) its leaf does not wither; and
- c) in whatever he does, he prospers.

Here he switches to plural. Many won't enter by the narrow gate. (Matt.7:13-14)



If they choose to stand in the path of sinners, They won't be able to stand in the place of God's judgment.

*You can choose your choices, but not the results of those choices.*

This is the first "hymn" in the hymnal of the Jews, the Psalter. But it's subject is not praise and worship. It's not even a prayer. It's almost an amplified proverb. And the subject? The importance of living a righteous life rooted in a focus on God's Word.

The wicked - "They have taken their degree in vice, and as true Doctors of Damnation they are installed and are looked up to by others as Masters of Belial. But the blessed man, the man to whom all the blessings of God belong, can hold no communion with such characters as these. He keeps himself pure from these lepers; he puts away evil things from him as garments spotted by the flesh; he comes out from among the wicked and goes without the camp, bearing the reproach of Christ. O for grace to be thus separate from sinners." (Spurgeon, *Treasury of David*)
